## Example of calls received by the OBG help desk

- CPAs often ask to become a DTO (Direct Transaction Owner) of a business account stating the company wants it as well. DTO should always be a direct employee of the business account CPA can be DTO of their own CPA business account but not the client's business account CPA should request access to become filing administrator for the client's business account
- A Letterhead process is required if the current filing administrator of the business account is no longer with the business, and you are asking to be set as filing administrator.
- Each person must have their own OHID and not take over some one else OHID account. Log-in information must not be shared.
- Calls received from companies asking why there were so many requests to gain access to their business account on OBG. CPAs should make their clients aware when they are adding additional filers to the client's business account
